In response to school closures to address the COVID-19 emergency, Bellevue Elementary School District adopted an Extended Learning Opportunity Plan in collaboration with the Tuolumne County Superintendent of Schools and other Schools Districts in the County. The link is prominently displayed on the County and District website. The goal of the plan is to provide a robust and engaging, blended learning education for all Bellevue students in grades TK-8th grade. The primary focus is to master the ELA and Math Common Core State Standards, however the Next Generation Science Standards, Social Studies Standards, as well as Physical Fitness Activities are also provided.

Bellevue officially closed school beginning on March 16, 2020 and remained closed for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year. Teachers transitioned immediately to distance learning options. All students are provided the opportunity to participate in class Zoom meetings with their classroom teacher where they can receive direct instruction and continue to receive a comprehensive learning experience. Classroom Zoom meetings increase in their frequency according to grade level. Students in the middle grades complete assignments using the Google Classroom Platform. Chromebooks have been made available to check out for all those students who require one. The School District has also provided information on free or low-cost Internet providers, as well as a hotspot link, so families without Internet Access can be provided connectivity, so they can access all the distance learning opportunities. For a small percentage of families who requested it, paper packets are provided.

The major impact to students and families is the lack of socialization for the students and the support that must be provided by parents, particularly in the lower grades. The District has focused on provided a comprehensive social and emotional program for children that includes spirit days, parades, the "Cardboard Challenge", games and activities and a "Help Ticket" that parents can submit to the Superintendent that will provide social-emotional support by the County Psychologist for those in need.

The Bellevue Elementary School District currently does not have any English Language Learners to address. The District continues to provide its low-income students with targeted instructional and support services to ensure that these students are meeting and exceeding the State Standards.

The Belleview Elementary School District teachers have delivered high-quality distance learning opportunities to each of their students by maintaining personal and individualized contact with each child and providing a comprehensive learning experience. Teachers have quickly adapted to using technology for imparting instruction, provide blended educational activities and have continuously assessed and provided feedback to each student. Teachers are effectively utilizing Zoom Conferencing, Google Classroom, County ELO Collaboration to deliver long-distance learning. Many teachers have created Google sites to consolidate classroom activities, as well as utilizing the links on the District's website so that students and their families have easy access.

The Belleview Elementary School District provides meal service to all families with children under the age of 18. Breakfast and lunch are distributed daily (M-F) between 11-1pm. The Belleview Food Services Manager prepares fresh meals daily, packages and distributes to all families including those on free and reduced lunch. We ask that families RSVP to let us know the number of meals requested but will provide food to any families who wish to drive through at this time.

Provide a description of the steps that have been taken by the LEA to arrange for supervision of students during ordinary school hours.

During the school closure period beginning March 16, 2020, the Tuolumne County Superintendent of Schools and LEAs in partnership with Infant Child Enrichment Services (ICES) provided referrals to childcare facilities and caregivers. There is access to any and all families that needed supervision of students during the school hours with preference given to children of essential workers. The information about the availability of ICES services was distributed through social media campaigns, radio ads, and by direct mailing. The availability of childcare spots have remained consistent and there has been no need to operate any pop-up childcare facilities.

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
