Also worked on fine motor skills development, which helps them in writing in Kindergarten and beyond. After Covid, children's ability to follow directions and stay focused seemed to be difficult. And separation anxiety seemed higher.**

**Kim feels like the preschool space is too small. Looking for a storage area to allow things to be moved out and stored, this will allow more room in the classroom for students and staff. One of the bathrooms needs upgrades. Sinks are too high, students have to use stool to use the sinks. Cafeteria tables are not made for Pre-school age students.**

**Parent survey given to parents, results were favorable. Goals for next year will be to get parents more involved in the classroom activities.**
